

## **UK Gender Pay Gap Report**

The Equality Act 2010 (Gender Pay Gap Information) Regulations 2017 (the "Regulations") requires employers with 250 or more employees in England, Scotland, and Wales to publish statutory calculations showing the pay gap between their male and female employees. The six metrics required by the Regulations are:

- Mean gender pay gap
- Median gender pay gap
- Mean bonus gender pay gap
- Median bonus gender pay gap
- Proportion of males and females receiving a bonus payment
- Proportion of males and females in each quartile band

As an employer with 238 employees working in the UK, Diamond Offshore Drilling (UK) Ltd does not meet the criteria for mandatory reporting under the Regulations. However, we have chosen to voluntarily report this information in the spirit of transparency as we continue our commitment to reducing the gender pay gap within our business. The information below is based on data from the snapshot date of 5 April 2022:
